

# **The Regulations for the Evaluation of Student Conduct Scores at National Central University**

Article 1 The evaluation of student conduct scores at the University shall be conducted in accordance with these Regulations.

Article 2 The passing score for student conduct is 60. Students who fail to achieve a passing score shall be dismissed from the University.

The student conduct score for the entire semester is calculated by adding to or subtracting from a base score of 85.

When the Office of Student Affairs calculates conduct scores, it shall be done numerically; if necessary, the corresponding grade may also be recorded.

Article 3 The grading scale for student conduct scores is as follows:

1. Excellent (Level A+): 90 points or above.
2. Level A: 80 points or above, but less than 90 points.
3. Level B: 70 points or above, but less than 80 points.
4. Level C: 60 points or above, but less than 70 points.
5. Level D (Fail): Less than 60 points.

Article 4 Faculty and staff members may list specific facts regarding students with exceptional meritorious or derogatory conduct and submit reward or punishment recommendations via the Student Affairs System in accordance with the Student Rewards and Punishments Regulations. These recommendations shall be processed by the Student Assistance Division (Life Guidance Division) of the Office of Student Affairs.

Article 5 The regulations for adding or subtracting points from the conduct score based on merits and demerits are as follows:

1. Merits: Each Commendation adds 1 point.  
Each Minor Merit adds 3 points.  
Each Major Merit adds 9 points.
2. Demerits: Each Warning subtracts 1 point.  
Each Minor Demerit subtracts 3 points.  
Each Major Demerit subtracts 9 points.

- Article 6 All units shall complete the approval process for reward and punishment recommendations within the Student Affairs System before the end-of-semester deadline for such submissions.
- Article 7 A student's graduation conduct score shall be the average of their conduct scores from each semester during their period of enrollment at the University.
- Article 8 These Regulations shall be implemented upon approval by the Student Affairs Council and subsequent ratification by the President. The same procedures shall apply to any future revisions.
