

The Regulations for the Establishment of the National Central University Student Awards and Punishments Committee

Article 1 In order to cultivate students' sound character, encourage excellent performance, ensure appropriate and fair rewards and punishments, and protect student rights, National Central University (hereafter, "the University") establishes the Student Awards and Punishments Committee (hereafter, "the Committee") in accordance with Article 33 of the University Act and Article 49 of the National Central University Organizational Regulations.

Article 2 The duties of the Committee are as follows:

- 1.Revisions to the Student Rewards and Punishments Regulations.
- 2.Deliberation of major student reward and punishment cases.
- 3.Deliberation of special cases regarding students' conduct scores.
- 4.Selection and approval of Outstanding Students.
- 5.Research and planning of other matters related to student rewards and punishments.

Article 3 The composition of the Committee is as follows:

- 1.The Vice President for Student Affairs (Dean of Student Affairs), the Vice President for Academic Affairs (Dean of Academic Affairs), and the Director of the Counseling Center.
- 2.One faculty member at the rank of Assistant Professor or above recommended by each College.
- 3.Five student representatives, elected by student self-governance organizations.

Members of this Committee may not concurrently serve as members of the "Student Appeal and Appraisal Committee."

The term of office for Committee members is one year, and members may be re-elected for consecutive terms.

The Committee shall have one Chairperson, served concurrently by the Dean of Student Affairs; and one Executive Secretary, served concurrently by the Head of the Student Assistance Division (Life Guidance Division).

- Article 4 Meetings of the Committee shall be convened by the Chairperson as needed.
A meeting may only be held if more than half of the Committee members are present, and at least one student representative must be in attendance.
Members must attend meetings in person and may not appoint or entrust others to attend on their behalf.
- Article 5 Resolutions for the determination of special major reward cases (Special Awards, Honorary Awards) or special major punishment cases (Required Withdrawal, Expulsion of Academic Status) shall require the approval of more than half of the total members of the Committee. Resolutions for all other matters shall be implemented upon the approval of more than half of the members present at the meeting.
- Article 6 When the Committee convenes, relevant personnel may be invited to attend and provide explanations in accordance with the relevant provisions of the University Student Rewards and Punishments Regulations as needed.
- Article 7 All participants in the meetings shall maintain strict confidentiality regarding the content of the meetings and the opinions expressed by the members.
- Article 8 These Regulations are approved by the Student Affairs Council and submitted to the University Assembly for reference before implementation.
The same procedures shall apply to any future revisions.
